

NPH celebrates the centenary of council housing

CENTENARY HOUSE



NPH Voice Issue 14 Summer 2019

On 31st July 1919, the Addison Act was passed into law. This legislation paved the way for large scale council house building in the UK.

We thought this was something to celebrate, especially as we are building substantial numbers of new council homes in Northampton for the first time in decades.

On 31st July this year, we started our celebrations at Cottarville where tenants first moved into new council homes 100 years ago. Johnnie Amos from BBC Radio Northampton selected a beautiful Amelanchier tree and helped Andrew Lewer MP with the planting to commemorate this special anniversary. Thank you to all the Cottarville residents who came out to join the fun!

Daphne, our neighbourhood bus, led the convoy to the next stop, Northfield Road, where we have just completed five brand new two-bedroom homes. We can't wait to welcome new tenants later this month.

We also decided to name a new family development in Hunsbury Centenary House to mark 100 years of council housing. You can find out more about this development in Chris' project diary to follow.

DEVELOPMENT NEWS

BLOCK TRANSFORMATION PROVIDES 40 NEW FAMILY HOMES



Former single person's block Overslade House has been completely remodelled and renamed Centenary House in the centenary year of council housing in the UK. The block was officially opened by The Rt Honourable Andrea Leadsom MP, who was joined by local councillors and some of Centenary House's new residents.

Sabrina Moussi who will be moving into her new apartment in September said: "I'm so excited and surprised to get a home in the area I've lived in for the last 13 years, it's like a dream! My son goes to Abbeyfied Primary school, so all his friends live nearby.

"The best thing is that the apartments are brand new and we still have a little bit of outdoor space of our own for plants and flowers as well as a lovely play area and green space to share with neighbours. Claire from NPH who helped me with my application was wonderful and really helped me. I am so happy!"

The NPH Voice team will be going back to Centenary House once all residents have moved in to see how they are getting on!

MORE NEW HOMES NEXT SPRING

Work is well underway at Toms Close in Collingtree to build 21 new family homes. Previously, 10 Airey homes were located on this site. The homes were poorly constructed with low energy efficiency, so a decision was made by NPH to demolish and replace them. This gave us an opportunity to build an additional 11 homes on the site.

Foundations have been laid, scaffolding is up and the brick work is underway! We can't wait to see this development progress and welcome new tenants to this lovely location.

FARM FIELD COURT LOOKING GOOD



This development, on the former Tanners pub site, will provide 17 new homes with a community café, shop and takeaway.

3 NEW WHEELCHAIR ACCESSIBLE BUNGALOWS IN KINGS HEATH

Homes for residents with disabilities are in short supply, so we are really excited



about this development.

The bungalows are complete and final checks are being made before tenants move in.

PLANNING CONSENT GRANTED FOR SPRING BOROUGHS DEVELOPMENT



For some time, residents of Berkeley House and St Mary's Court have raised issues about the condition of their blocks as well as the lack of security, green space and parking. NPH has been working with residents to nd alternative homes so that good quality homes can be built on the site.

Helen Town, Assistant Director: Asset Management and Development said of the scheme: "This is of course unsettling for everyone involved and we are working with individuals and families to make sure that they get the support and assistance they need."

The plans for the new development now have planning approval and will increase the number of homes on the site whilst creating green space, parking and better security for residents. Look out for an update in the next issue.



Cutting edge gardening services

Sixth form students from Billing Brook School set up a gardening project to help tenants who are unable to maintain their garden themselves. The school applied to Happy to Help for funding to buy a lawn mower to support the project.

Move in service

Happy to Help also provides small grants to help individuals or families in crisis. These applications are made by support workers on behalf of the resident and can make a real difference in tough times.

It's early days for Happy to Help, but there is lots more to come. The Paint Shop in Kings Heath will open its doors this Autumn, where recycled paint will be available to buy at low cost. Watch this space for more to come.
